Taster Sessions September 2013

The taster sessions group was designed to give the young people experience of a variety of activities and also enabled the children to have a say in what they wanted to do. At a number of our activities we have to cater to the wide range of ages, and for some of the children, the types of things we do can be slightly boring for them. They took the opportunity to give us suggestions on the types of things that they would like to get out of the youth groups, whether it was a certain game that we played, or potential ideas for future clubs.

Over the course of the club, we did a variety of things, ranging

from holding our own quiz night, to playing dodge ball, to having a movie night and so much more. Throughout the clubs the kids interacted well together, however again due to the age gap, we faced the difficulty of catering for all the children. It was also quite hard for some of the older children to remember that the younger ones might not know when they were just having a joke. For example one of the older boys was joking about a ghost and one of the younger boys got a bit upset and came up to me to say that he was scared. Once I had reassured him that the older boy was only being silly, and when that boy had realised what he

had done and apologised everything was fine.
